NCAA Fencing Championships (1941 to present)

In the November 1939 issue of *The Riposte* magazine, it was reported that a group of eastern, midwestern, and southern universities had submitted a request to the NCAA that they hold a national championship for men's fencing. For the first year, they proposed that only individual events be run, leaving team championships to be developed in future years. The NCAA finally approved this request in December of 1940.

The first NCAA fencing championship was held on one day, March 29, 1941, on five pistes at Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio. Seventy-six men from 19 schools fenced from 9am to 11pm to determine the three individual champions. Participation was somewhat weakened by the fact that the schools in the northeast were participating in the Intercollegiate Fencing Association championships (which had been the *de facto* national championships for fencing) at Princeton University on the same day.

While only the three individual championships were officially contested, Yale University donated a perpetual trophy to be given to the school with the greatest combined number of individual victories. The last mention I could find of the Yale Trophy being awarded was in an article about the 1953 Championships but by then the NCAA was officially recognizing a team championship and past winners were listed in NCAA publications as past NCAA team champions. The present location of the Yale Trophy is unknown.

The NCAA has held championships in fencing every year since 1941 except for the four years 1943-46 during World War II and its reconstruction and in 2020 because of the coronavirus pandemic. From 1941 through 1981, the championships were limited to men's fencing events and four championships were contested: men's epee individual, men's foil individual, men's sabre individual, and team (i.e., men's three-weapon).

For these early championships, there were no qualifying competitions. From 1941 to 1947, each school (see **School Names** on page 8) could enter two fencers in each weapon, from 1948 to 1983 one fencer, and from 1984 to present two fencers but only via qualifying competitions. Until 1976 each school paid the entire expenses of their fencers attending the championships. Then the NCAA started paying some of the expenses of the fencers attending but also implemented restrictions on the total number of entries, first to 40 in each weapon and eventually down to 24. Since fencers now had to qualify for the Championships, many schools found out that they could no longer satisfy the qualification standards to send fencers.

In the early Championships, a fencer was allowed to compete in more than one weapon. Andre Deladrier of St. John's (NY) won the sabre championship in 1942 and also fenced in the epee and foil events that year finishing second in both (see **Andre Deladrier and the 1942 NCAA Championships** on page 9). Abraham Balk of NYU won both the epee and the foil championships in 1947. Two years after that, fencers were restricted to only one weapon during one Championship. Since then, several fencers have fenced different weapons in different Championships but the only fencers to win the individual championship in more than one weapon have been Ben Atkins of Columbia/Barnard who won the foil in 1991 and the epee in 1993 and Felicia Zimmerman of Stanford who won the foil in 1998 and the epee in 1999. For a list of those fencers who have won more than one NCAA fencing championship, see **Multiple Individual Championships** on page 5.

There have been cases of fencers transferring schools and representing different schools at different championships. Two recent examples are the men's foil fencer Daniel Cohen who represented Duke in 2009 finishing 6th and then Air Force in 2011 finishing 3rd. Men's epee fencer Brent Kelly represented Columbia in 2008 finishing 21st and then Notre Dame in 2011 finishing 16th.

Various formats have been used for running the championships. During most years, the championships were run as a complete round robin in each weapon with the individual champion decided by whoever had the greatest number of victories at the end of the round robin. If two or more fencers had the same number of victories, first place was decided by a fence-off while all remaining places were recorded as ties or by using touch indicators or touch counts to resolve ties. Recently, the top four fencers after the round robin have fenced direct-elimination bouts to determine the top four places. Originally the losers of the first two bouts fenced a bout to determine third and fourth places but then this additional bout was dropped and the two fencers are tied for third place.

In most years, the team championship was decided by adding to total number of victories a school had in all of the individual championships, not counting any fence-off victories, though some years (e.g., 1966, 1990-1997) other scoring systems were used. Since 2013, touch indicators have been used to break all ties.

When electrical scoring machines for foil were first introduced in the early 1950s, the early models had problems registering off-target touches correctly. So, for the 1954-5 collegiate fencing season including the 1955 NCAA Championships, the NCAA coaches adopted a "no-foul" rule for foil and sabre that had been successfully used by the Big Ten fencing schools for the previous four years. Instead of using these faulty scoring machines, foil was fenced non-electrical with side judges used to determine whether touches had landed. The "no-foul" rule meant that the referee and side-judges ignored off-target touches in both foil and sabre bouts. They neither caused the fencing action to be halted nor did they prevent a valid touch in a subsequent action from being scored.

At the end of the 1955 Championships, a survey was made to determine its success. The coaches and fencers were strongly in favor of continuing to use the "no-foul" rule for the following season or even permanently. The fencing officials were mostly opposed to the rule, mainly because they had trouble adjusting between using it during collegiate competitions while not using it during non-collegiate competitions. They did, however, think that the rule made it easier for spectators to follow the action and easier for the referees to agree on the validity of awarding touches.

By this time, the electrical scoring machines had been improved to eliminate early problems and the FIE announced that they would not be adopting a "no-foul" rule for international competitions. US Fencing therefore decided that they would also not adopt a "no-foul" rule because it would mean that the schools would have to buy special fencing machines that did not register off-target touches and because the fencing officials did not want to officiate at different competitions using such radically different rules. Ironically, when sabre was finally electrified in 1988, it was found difficult to show off-target sabre hits on the fencing machines and so sabre fencing then adopted the "no-foul" rule, some thirty years after U.S. collegiate fencing had proved that it was feasible.

In 1966, the Ivy League schools boycotted the NCAA championships in all sports because of a dispute about academic standards. The NCAA fencing championships that year used a format not used in any of the other championships. The team championship was determined on the last day only among the 27

schools that had brought a fencer in each of the 3 weapons. First the schools were seeded into four groups of six or seven schools. The schools fenced the other schools in their group and the four highest finishing schools in each group advanced to a double-elimination direct elimination. Schools that did not promote out of the first round or did not bring 3 fencers were not included in the NCAA's official team championship standings. For schools in the NCAA's official team standings, I show their record in the preliminary groups and then their record in the double direct elimination. For the schools that did not promote, I show them as tied for 17th place with their records in the preliminary groups. For schools that participated in the individual events but not in the team event, I show them as "NP" (not participating) in the team results.

In 1977, New York University and Notre Dame finished in a tie for first place with 114 victories each. Under the rules then in place, the two schools should have been declared co-champions. Hugo Castello, the NYU coach, and Mike DeCicco, the Notre Dame coach, went together to the bout committee and said that they did not want a co-championship. Instead, they proposed that their sabre, foil, and epee fencers fence each other in that order and whichever school won two of the three bouts would be the champion and the other school would be second. Since the coaches were in agreement, the bout committee waived the rules and allowed the fence-off. Notre Dame won the first two bouts (making the third bout unnecessary) and was declared the sole team champion.

Beginning in 1982, two women's NCAA championships were contested: women's foil individual and women's team. A selection committee determined the 24 fencers who could fence in the individual event with a limit of three fencers from a school. The team event was completely separate from the individual event. The selection committee determined which schools could fence in the team event and so there could be completely different fencers fencing in the two events, even from the same school. At first eight schools competed in the women's team event but this was increased to twelve teams in 1987.

The first two women's NCAA championships were held at a different venue and on different dates than the men's championships in those years. Starting in 1984, the two championships were hosted by the same school on consecutive days. The inclusion of women's fencing meant that there were two overall team championships: a men's team which was based on the combined results in the 3 men's events and a women's team which was based on just the women's foil results.

In 1990, the single men's 3-weapon team championship was changed into three team championships, one for each weapon, and one combined team championship was awarded for the best combined men's and women's results. In addition to these team championships, individual championships were also held. For schools that participated in the individual events but not in the team event, I show them as "NP" (not participating) in the team results.

In 1995, women's epee was added to the championships and the four weapon-specific team championships were dropped leaving only the combined (now 5-weapon) team championship which included the women's epee results. The format returned to individual events with the team championship determined by adding together the number of victories in the individual events.

At some time during the 1990s, the NCAA suddenly changed its description of the NCAA fencing championships to indicate that the first championship was held in 1990 and that all of the previous ones were "discontinued events". Documentation about those previous championships was removed from the NCAA web site and not included in the programs of subsequent championships. Even the numbering was changed as if the 1990 championships was the first. The NCAA said that the change was

done because the format of the championships had changed that year without indicating what change caused them to ignore the previous championships. Eventually the NCAA removed all references to these "discontinued events" and currently shows documentation about only the championships held in 1990 and later.

Beginning in 2000 a women's sabre individual championship was added and those results were included in the combined (now 6-weapon) team championship. The NCAA fencing championships has thus consisted in its current format of six individual championships and one 6-weapon team championship since 2000.

In 2020, that year's national championship final round was canceled because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The regional qualifying competitions had been held before the cancelation was announced and so the 24 fencers in each weapon who would have competed in the final round had been determined.

In 2021, several schools and conferences (such as the Ivy League) did not hold any dual meets at all during the season and announced their intention of skipping the NCAA Championships. Regional Qualifying competitions were not held. Instead, a committee selected 24 fencers in each weapon to compete in the Championships.

In 2022, both the regional qualification and national championships were held, returning the format to the format that was used in 2019.

Championship Counts

Of the twelve different types of national championships that the NCAA has awarded in fencing, 35 schools have won at least one of them. The greatest number of NCAA fencing championships have been won by Columbia/Barnard with 62, followed by Notre Dame with 59, and Penn State with 53. The top three schools that have won the most of each type of championship are:

Men's Epee Individual (79 championships) – New York University (10), Columbia/Barnard, St. John's, and Wayne State University (8 each).

Men's Foil Individual (79 championships) – Wayne State University and Columbia/Barnard (11 each), and Notre Dame (9)

Men's Sabre Individual (79 championships) – Columbia/Barnard, New York University, and Penn State University (11 each)

Women's Epee Individual (29 championships) – Penn State University and Notre Dame (7 each), and St. John's (4)

Women's Foil Individual (42 championships) – Notre Dame (11), Penn State University (8), and Columbia/Barnard (6)

Women's Sabre Individual (24 championships) – Notre Dame (6), Harvard (4), and Columbia/Barnard and Duke (3 each)

Combined Team (34 championships) – Penn State University (13), Notre Dame (9), and Columbia/Barnard (5)

Men's 3-weapon Team [discontinued] (48 championships) – New York University (10 plus 2 shared with Columbia/Barnard), Columbia/Barnard (9 plus 2 shared with NYU), and Wayne State University (7)

Men's Epee Team [discontinued] (5 championships) – Columbia/Barnard (3), and Penn State University and Princeton (1 each)

Men's Foil Team [discontinued] (5 championships) – Columbia/Barnard and Yale (2 each), and Notre Dame (1)

Men's Sabre Team [discontinued] (5 championships) – Penn State University (2), and University of Pennsylvania, Columbia/Barnard, and Yale (1 each)

Women's Team [discontinued] (13 championships) – Penn State University and Wayne State University (4 each) and Yale (2)

"Fencer of the Year" and "All-American" Designations

The **Illinois Memorial Trophy** was awarded annually to the "Fencer of the Year" from 1951 until 1967. The fencers competing in the Championships voted to nominate one of the fencers in their own weapon based on sportsmanship and conduct on the strip, attitude and dress, and past performance in the Championships and in over-all intercollegiate competition. The recipient of the award was decided by a vote of the coaches present at that Championship from the three fencers so nominated.

Starting in 1968, the Illinois Memorial Trophy was presented only to the men's foil participant and two new trophies were created. The **Michigan State Memorial Trophy** was presented to the men's sabre participant and the **Princeton-Cornell Memorial Trophy** to the men's epee participant. These three designations were recognized by the NCAA. The last recorded awarding of these designations and trophies that I could find was at the 1980 Championships.

The designation of fencers as being **All-American** is not done by the NCAA. It is a designation awarded by the U.S. Fencing Coaches Association. This association was informally established during the late 1940s. At the first two or three NCAA Championships, it was just a gathering of the fencing coaches who had teams competing at those Championships. In 1948 the organization opened its membership to all fencing coaches and adopted the name "National Fencing Coaches Association of America" (NFCAA). In 1949 the association became official when a constitution was formally adopted.

In 1950 the USFCA appointed a "Committee to Select an All-American Collegiate Team". In 1951 the top four finishers in each weapon in that year's NCAA Championships were awarded the designation of All-American. The designation was based solely on competitive results at that Championship. At some later championship the designation was expanded to six fencers and divided into two classes: First Team All-American and Second Team All-American. Eventually a third class of Honorable Mention All-American was added.

The number of designations was changed from three to four in each weapon, probably when the format of the Championships was changed to use direct elimination and a bout for third place was not held. In 2020, eight fencers were so designated in each weapon because of the cancellation of the Championships due to the corona virus pandemic. The determination of which fencers fell into which of the three classes was made that year by the USFCA based on competitive results during the season. See the "USFCA 2020 All-American Designations" section at the end of this report.

Exactly when the designation was divided up into classes and the number that were awarded each year are still being researched. It is believed that designations were made retroactively when the designation was first established and when the new classifications were established which makes determining when these changes were actually made more difficult. The All-American designation in fencing has never been officially recognized by the NCAA.

School Names

Documenting the results has been somewhat complicated by the fact that some schools have changed their names during the time they competed, either because of a simple name change (e.g., **Michigan State College** became **Michigan State University** in 1964) or because of a merger with another school. In most cases I have listed all of the school's results under the school's current name except where that might result in confusion. In order to save space, I have also listed results under commonly used names of schools and/or used abbreviations rather than the formal names of the schools.

Cleveland State University was founded in 1964 and absorbed **Fenn College** in 1965. Fenn College sponsored a men's fencing team at various times during the 1931-1965 period and sent fencers to the NCAA Fencing Championships 11 times between 1950 and 1964 where they competed under the name of Fenn College. All of those results are listed under the current name of Cleveland State University.

The Case Institute of Technology merged with Western Reserve University in 1967 to become Case Western Reserve. Adelbert College was a subsidiary of Western Reserve University. In the first two years after the merger, fencing teams were entered under the name of Adelbert College rather than Case Western Reserve. Case Institute of Technology competed in 11 Championships between 1941 and 1965. Western Reserve University competed in 4 Championships between 1948 and 1965. Since both competed as separate schools in the 1965 Championships, I have listed their results prior to the merger under their separate names to avoid confusion. The Adelbert College results in the 1968 and 1969 NCAA Championships are shown as Case Western Reserve.

San Fernando Valley State College became **California State – Northridge** in 1972. Its fencers competed under the former name until 1972 and under the latter name starting with the 1973 Championships. All of the results are listed under the current name of Cal. St. – Northridge.

Columbia University was a men's-only school until 1983 and competed under that name while the NCAA sponsored just men's fencing. **Barnard College**, a Columbia affiliated women's-only school, competed under that name during the years that there was a separate overall women's championship. The two schools have competed as **Columbia/Barnard** since the team championship was combined and female students enrolled in Barnard College were allowed to compete on a combined fencing team. All of their results are listed as Columbia/Barnard.

Cal State - Hayward became Cal State - East Bay in 2005. The new name is used in this report.

Brooklyn Polytech was the common name for the **Polytechnic Institute of Brooklyn** which briefly changed its name to the **Polytechnic Institute of New York** before it merged as the engineering school of **New York University**. **Polytech Inst. of NY** is used in this report.

The **University of Buffalo** merged with the State University of New York system in 1962 and became the **State University of New York at Buffalo**. This is usually abbreviated to **Buffalo State** or **SUNY – Buffalo**. The last name is used in this report.

The **Lawrence Institute of Technology** in Michigan and **Lawrence University** in Wisconsin were both listed as just "**Lawrence**" in several results listings. I believe that I have successfully identified which fencers went to which school.

Trivia and Factoids

Over the course of the NCAA fencing championships since 1941, 32 different schools have hosted them with Notre Dame having hosted the most with ten, Ohio State with eight, and Penn State with six.

Wayne State University is the only school to have participated in all of the NCAA fencing championships.

Columbia/Barnard, Harvard, Notre Dame, Princeton, and St. John's are the only schools to have won at least one individual championship in each of the six weapons. Three schools have won at least one individual championship in five of six weapons with Ohio State, Penn State, and Wayne State each lacking a women's sabre champion.

Charles Schmitter, the Michigan State fencing coach from 1938 to 1983, made a special effort to invite boys with only one arm to try out for his fencing team and had several while he was coach. At the 1947 NCAA Championships, his epee fencer, Jacob Geert Venema, had only one arm. He had lost his right arm in an auto accident six years previously. He had been right-handed and so had to learn how to use his left hand instead and then took up fencing at Michigan State. He qualified out of the first round but was eliminated in the semi-finals.

At the 1949 NCAA Championships, the Yale epee fencer, John Byrd "Jack" French, who placed third with a 20-6 record, was a 24 year old army veteran who had lost his right hand in combat during WW II while serving in the Pacific and so learned to fence left-handed at Yale.

Fencing is the only NCAA or Olympic combat sport with no weight classes. The 1952 epee champion was Herman Wallner of NYU who was 6 feet 7 inches tall.

Andre Deladrier and the 1942 NCAA Championships

Andre Deladrier was the son of Clovis Deladrier who was the fencing coach of the Naval Academy from 1933 to 1947. Andre became the fencing coach at the Naval Academy in 1958 but was attending St. John's University in New York City as an undergraduate in 1942 when he was 21 years old. The 1942 NCAA Fencing Championships were only the second one that the NCAA held and they were at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri.

Only one other St. John's fencer wanted to go, so the two of them got in a car and drove from New York City to St. Louis. This was before the interstate highway system was built and so it took them 30 hours of non-stop driving over secondary roads.

Fencers were allowed to enter more than one weapon and so Deladrier entered all three even though that Championships was a one-day competition and so all three weapons were being contested on the same day. He then fenced a total of 41 bouts in one day (counting the fence-off bouts) and had 30 victories, 9 losses, and two double-defeats (which, at that time, was how double touches in epee were recorded). He took first place in sabre by winning ten of his twelve bouts and then winning a fence-off bout with Bill Hunt by the score of 5-1. He won ten of fourteen bouts in one-touch epee and had two double-defeats in a three-way fence-off in epee to take second place. He won nine of twelve bouts in foil to finish in second place to Byron Krieger who was undefeated.

Research Issues Outstanding

Some of the issues about the NCAA Fencing Championships that are still outstanding:

- The first Championships in 1941 awarded titles only for the three individual championships. No overall team championship was awarded. Yale University donated a trophy to be given to the school that would have won a team championship. The records of the 1954 Championships show that the NCAA was by then officially recognizing a team championship and had retroactively recognized the winners of the Yale Trophy in past years as those years' team champion. It is not known when the NCAA officially did this.
- It is not known when the Yale Trophy, the Illinois Memorial Trophy, the Michigan State Trophy, and the Princeton-Cornell Trophy were last awarded and what happened to those physical trophies.
- The All-American designation by the NFCAA was originally given to just the top 4 finishers at the Championships starting in 1951. At some point the number of designations was increased to six and divided into two classes with 3 in each class: First Team All-American and Second Team All-American. Even later an additional expansion created a third class: Honorable Mention All-American. It is not known when these additional classes were created, how many designations were made each year, and if or when the designations were made retroactive.

NCAA Fencing Championship "Fencer of the Year" Trophies

The Illinois Memorial Trophy was awarded annually to the "Fencer of the Year" from 1951 until 1967. The fencers competing in the Championships voted to nominate one of the fencers in their weapon on the basis of sportsmanship and conduct on the strip, attitude and dress, and past performance in the Championships and in over-all intercollegiate competition. The recipient of the award was decided based on a vote by the coaches present at that Championship from the three fencers so nominated.

Starting in 1968, the Illinois Memorial Trophy was presented to the top men's foil participant and two new trophies were created. The Michigan State Memorial Trophy was presented to the top men's sabre participant and the Princeton-Cornell Memorial Trophy to the top men's epee participant. The last recorded awarding of these trophies was at the 1980 Championships.

NCAA Fencing Men's Team Championship (1941-1989)

The team standings shown here are mostly from the NCAA Championship reports which are not always completely accurate with regard to the lower placments. I have found newspaper articles about some of the championships with different finishes and/or number of victories for the lower placing teams or listing schools that the official NCAA reports do not show at all. One example is the very first Championship in 1941 which the official NCAA report itself says that 19 schools competed in but then lists only 18 schools. I found the name and results of the school that finished nineteenth (with no victories) in a 1941 newspaper article. But whether the NCAA report or the newspaper articles are more accurate for other years could not be determined. So the standings and scores show here for teams placing lower than second should be considered as approximations.

No championships were held 1943-1946 because of World War II. For the 1966 Championships, see the introductary write-up for an explanation of that year's team standings.


